Actions - Major Themes

Covid-19

- Equity amongst responsibilities
- Push for greater support (e.g., funding, remote working condition)

Anti-Black Racism

Discussion prompts

how do we reimagine the vision and mission of AGEP to include critical actions with foundations in antiracism supporting all members of the AGEP community, especially those most vulnerable during #timesofrona?

Group 1: impact of covid on campus (labs and testing). Increased awareness of anything related to racism. Aware of the need for change. Minds are receptive to making a difference. AGEP can provide more opportunities for promoting more communication among alliances, learning from one each other (Across alliances).

Group 2: allies and community support. What battles to fight, navigating the rules. Rely on AGEP community to increase professional visibility - improve research profiles.

Group 3: all are vulnerable at this time. Acknowledging traditional and non-traditional groups experiencing racism. Solution of heart and structure. Being sensitive to the experiences of others. Structure and connection; establishing connectedness, facilitate alliance actions in an online platform. Care-packages for the virtual conference. Shifting to work more around structural oppression, creating change institutional structural. Buy-in through the literature and sharing literature with leadership.
